The Saugeen Shores Police Services called a meeting via ZOOM to discuss the role of the Police Service in the Province wide shut down commencing on April 17<sup>th</sup> at 12:01 as noted by Premier Ford and the Solicitor General on April 15.

The Chief outlined what was being considered to be implemented and what he has done and discussions with various agencies on this matter.

~~ The Chief advised had a meeting with Premier Ford and Sylvia Jones yesterday afternoon at 2:15 pm.

~~ He advised the members of increased police authority to help combat COVID 19 with the new restrictions to take effect on Monday.

~~ He advised that Premier Ford wants Police to help limit mobility and help with enforcement.

~~ He advised that the Provincial Government would cover the cost of any and all overtime related to enforcement of the Stay-at-home order.

~~ He advised he was not comfortable with random stops.

~~ He advised he is seeking support to continue with the 4 e's – engage, explain, educate and enforce.

~~ The new order has expanded Police authority to stop individuals found in public spaces to ensure they are compliant with the Stay-at-home order. He advised that individuals will be required to provide Officers their home address and the purpose for being outside of the residence. The order gives Police additional powers to assess compliance and implement a level of enforcement.

~~ He advised that the Saugeen Shores Police Service will be conducting evidence based investigations concerning this Stay-at-home order. He advised while it is not the intention of our Police Service to conduct wholesale random spot checks, persons who appear to be in violation of the order may find themselves being approached by an Officer.


~~ He advised that the Saugeen Shores Police Service will maintain a complaint and proactive driven model of enforcement and compliance with the Provincial Stay-at-home order.


~~ The Chief advised that he is still waiting to receive the updated legislation and will share with the Board when that happens. The All Chiefs memo was supposed to be received at midnight last night but at the time of the meeting it still has not been received.

~~ The Chief advised he has spoken with a lot of the area Police Service Chiefs.

~~ The Chief also spoke about Section 22 Class Order received from Dr. Ian Arra and how he will be seeking legal advice prior to any enforcement agreement with public health and will forward a copy to the Board members.
